



In partnership with the Municipality of Wawa, a ceremony and celebration is being scheduled for Tuesday, November 10th starting at 1:30 pm, at the Broadway Avenue Park (basketball court) on Mission Road in Wawa.

MFN's flag will be raised and flown in Wawa to recognize that the community shares MFN's treaty and traditional territories.

Two flags will be flown on Mission Road; 1 adjacent to the Broadway Avenue Park (basketball court) and 1 adjacent to the United Church on Mission Road.

Council, Citizens, staff and friends are cordially invited to participate on this special occasion.

Councillor and Elder William Swanson will accept a tobacco offering from the Mayor and present the flags on our behalf.

After the flag raising, everyone is invited to attend MFN's Cultural Lodge (Michipicoten High School Grounds) for refreshments.


